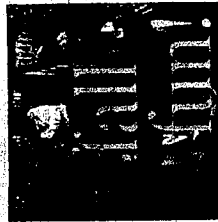

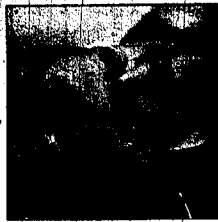

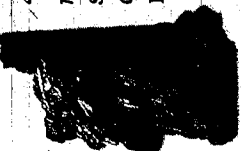

Goffstown mom arrested after leaving child, 1, in bar

A Goffstown woman pleaded innocent yesterday to leaving her year-old daughter in the care of a man in a Manchester bar Tuesday afternoon.

Donna Roy, 39, of 476 Riverdale Road, was ar-

rested in Manchester District Court yesterday on misdemeanor charges of endangering the welfare of a child, theft of services and operating a motor vehicle under the influence of liquor or drugs.

She also was charged with a Class B felony of possessing crack cocaine.

"It's totally wrong what they have in the report as far as leaving my child" with a stranger, Roy told the judge.

Judge Norman Champagne set a probable cause hearing on the felony charge for Oct. 18. A Nov. 20 trial was scheduled for the misdemeanors.

Bail was set at \$1,000 cash or surety, but the judge considered raising it to \$10,000 cash when Roy questioned bail conditions that prevent her from unsupervised visits with her daughter, Karri Ann.

"As far as my child and me not being able to be

together, that's crazy," she said. "My husband works full time. How can we manage that?" Roy said she took a leave of absence from her job to take care of her daughter.

Police prosecutor Sgt. Steve Ranfos told the judge the state was concerned for the child's safety and wanted to be assured that Roy would not be alone with the child.
