EXAMINATION

Item L00-744-7a,

Visual and stereomicroscopic examination revealed the presence of five fingernail clippings with red brown stains. Presumptive chemical tests for the presence of blood were positive on these red brown stains. On 1-11-01, these fingernail clippings were submitted to the Forensic Biology Section of the Crime Laboratory for HemaTrace (a confirmatory test for the presence of human blood) and/or DNA analysis.

Item L00-744-7b,

Visual and stereomicroscopic examination revealed the presence of five fingernail clippings with red brown stains. Presumptive chemical tests for the presence of blood were positive on these red brown stains. On 1-11-01, these fingernail clippings were submitted to the Forensic Biology Section of the Crime Laboratory for HemaTrace and/or DNA analysis.

Results from the examination of the remaining items in this sexual assault kit will be submitted in a report issued by the Forensic Biology Section.

EXAMINATION :

Item L00-752-4,

Visual examination revealed the presence of several faint red brown stains on this paper napkin. Presumptive chemical tests for the presence of blood were positive on each of these stains. On 1-11-01, a cutting from one of these red brown stains was submitted to the Forensic Biology Section of the Crime Laboratory for HemaTrace (a confirmatory test for the presence of human blood) and or DNA analysis. Illumination with an alternate light source revealed the presence of several other stains on this napkin. On 1-11-01, a cutting from one of these stains was also submitted to the Forensic Biology Section of the Crime Laboratory.

Item L00-752-6,

Visual examination revealed this plastic bag to be unsealed and approximately 1/4 filled with a round chocolate cereal type substance. The approximate weight of the contents of this bag was determined to be 20.7 grams.

Item L00-752-12,

Visual examination revealed this paper towel to be soiled. Illumination with an alternate light source caused these soiled areas to fluoresce. On 1-11-01, a cutting was removed from a soiled area and submitted to the Forensic Biology Section of the Crime Laboratory.

Item L00-752-17,

This item was examined and photographed at the Maine State Police Crime Laboratory, in my presence, by Dr. Margaret Greenwald, Chief Medical Examiner.

Items L00-752-2, 3, 5, 7-11, 13-16,

No examinations of these items was requested at this time.
