

STALEY occasionally works with JEFF MARSHALL and made some observations of KASSIDY BORTNER.

STALEY told me he had seen KASSIDY five to six times over the span of a couple of months, when MARSHALL was babysitting her. When he first saw her, she wasn't bad at all, she talked a little, she was clean, and she seemed like a normal type kid. STALEY said he saw bruises on her legs and arms but he thought they were pretty normal for a kid, such as might result from a kid playing.

STALEY told me that about three days before KASSIDY'S death, he and MARSHALL went to look at a job, accompanied by KASSIDY. STALEY said that KASSIDY was filthy dirty, her hair was matted, her face was dirty, and her clothing looked like it had been worn for several days. STALEY said he remarked to MARSHALL, words to the effect of "Why does this kid look this way, doesn't her mother take care of her?" STALEY also said he observed bruises on KASSIDY'S face. He said the bruises were around her neck and chin area and looked as though somebody had grabbed her with their finger and thumb. STALEY said KASSIDY was very withdrawn, unlike earlier times he had seen her, she didn't talk at all and STALEY said it was like she wasn't acknowledging you, and he thought she might be a little slow mentally.
