The entire time Chad was in our employment he knew his time could possibly be limited, that never made a difference in the performance that Chad gave. He went out of his way to try to help the store in local marketing to help increase our sales.

I was able on several occasions to here Chad communicate with his son. Kyle is the center of his world. I cannot imagine anyone that expresses that much love for a child would ever in his lifetime cause harm to another child. The entire time I have known Chad I have never seen him lose his temper. There were many moments when, if I were in the same situation, I would have had a hard time controlling my anger. Chad is not the type of person that hides his emotions well. There were several times before the trial started that I saw him become disheartened, but he pulled himself together. The most important things to him in his life are his family and friends.

I don't feel I can find the correct words to express to you the type of person Chad Evans is. I am hoping that I was able to convey to you the Chad I know and care a great deal about.
